LEADERSHIP AT SAINT PHILIP NERI

Since its founding in 1993, St Philip Neri Church has been served by priests that belong to The Congregation of the Oratory of Saint Philip Neri, a pontifical society of apostolic life of Catholic priests and lay-brothers who live together in community bound together by no formal vows but only with the bond of charity. Saint Philip Neri established this religious community in the 16th century. Members are known as Oratorians and live in Oratory houses throughout the world.

The Rock Hill Oratory is the oldest house in the United States. Oratorians, who use the initials C.O. after their names, carry on Saint Philip Neri's charism of prayer, reflection on Scripture and work with the laity. They commit their lives to serving the faithful by promoting sacramental life and encouraging the faithful to be leaders in the Church.

PARISH ADVISORY COUNCILS & COMMITTEES

PASTORAL COUNCIL

The Pastoral Council's primary purpose is to represent the parishioners and serve as an advisory council to the pastor on matters related to the parish. Council members are appointed by the pastor and include one member of the Finance Council. Pastoral Council meets every month and on an ad-hoc basis as needed.

FINANCE COUNCIL

The Finance Council's primary purpose is to serve as an advisory council to the pastor on financial matters related to the parish. Council members are appointed by the pastor. The Finance Council meets monthly and on an adhoc basis as needed. The members of the Finance Council are the primary stewards of the parish's financial resources and are accountable for the integrity of the parish's finances.

PROPERTY AND FACILITY COMMITTEE

The Property and Facility Committee advises the pastor, Business Manager and Maintenance Technician about the management and maintenance of the church properties. This committee, which assesses the short-term and long-term needs for all facilities, also offers guidance and recommends necessary improvements.

DISCIPLESHIP/STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

The Discipleship/Stewardship Committee seeks to develop discipleship as a way of life in the parish, with members educating parishioners about embracing discipleship through the sharing of the gifts (time, talent and treasure) given to us by God. This committee is instrumental in the implementation, follow-up and evaluation of the parish's discipleship/stewardship program.

PARISH SAFETY TEAM

The Parish Safety Team, which provides security for the parish at weekend Masses and other events, has established, implemented and continues to assess the parish's safety and security plan. Team members are trained in first aid, CPR, evacuation techniques, safety responses to fire and weather emergencies and church security. In addition, they educate staff members, volunteers and parishioners about safety protocols that relate to the plan.

OUR PARISH COMMUNITY

Our parish, founded in 1993, started with 70 families. Today, St. Philip Neri has over 2,896 registered families and we continue to grow while we serve the needs of both our parish and the community through faith-filled actions, prayer, service and fellowship. During the past fiscal year, over 235 families registered with our parish community. We strive to be a welcoming parish that reflects the heart, mercy and teachings of Christ, the traditions of the Roman Catholic Church and the spirit of joy manifested by our patron saint St. Philip Neri.

Completed forms may be mailed, emailed or dropped off to the office for processing. This guidebook, "Our Ministry of Discipleship," provides information about the spiritual life at St. Philip Neri Catholic Church and the numerous ministries and organizations that serve our parish and community. BECOMING CATHOLIC

St. Philip Neri Catholic Church is committed to the presentation of the doctrine of our faith, in a welcoming and understandable manner, to members of our community who have made the decision to seek this step in their personal faith journey. We invite you to join with us as we strive to live the mission of Jesus Christ through prayer, service, outreach, fellowship and a true sense of family as we minister to our community.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process used by the Catholic Church to present the beliefs of this faith to those adults (age 18 and older) who have made a conscious decision to explore coming into full communion with the Church. Programs for teenagers (RCIT: Rite of Christian Initiation for Teens) and children (RCIC: Rite of Christian Initiation for Children) are also available. Spiritual formation and education about our Catholic faith takes place during these rites, which enables individuals to become fully incorporated into the Body of Christ, the Catholic Church.

RCIA classes begin in September and are held every other week until the Easter Vigil when those joining the Catholic Church will be received through the Sacraments of Initiation. THE SACRAMENTS

The Sacraments are Christ's own gift that provide us with His grace. They are the divine helps which God gave us to enable us to believe the truths of His faith, live according to His moral code and grow in His gift of divine life. The **Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) affirms that** "the seven sacraments touch all the stages and all the important moments in Christian life. They give birth and increase healing and mission to the Christian's life of faith."

THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION — Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist—lay the foundations of every Christian life. The faithful are born anew by Baptism, strengthened by the sacrament of Confirmation and receive in the Eucharist the food of eternal life.

BAPTISM

For Catholics, the sacrament of Baptism is the first step in a lifelong journey of commitment and discipleship. It is the Church's way of celebrating and enacting the embrace of God. St. Philip Neri Catholic Church offers the sacrament of Baptism on the first and third Saturdays of each month at 12:00 pm. Baptisms may also be celebrated during weekend Masses. Parents are required to register for and attend a baptism preparation class. Classes are held at 7:00 pm on the third Tuesday of every month. To schedule a baptism, attend a baptism class, or request additional information, please contact the Parish Office.

CONFIRMATION

By the sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. The Confirmation at St. Philip Neri aims to prepare 10th graders to receive the fullness of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation. Through the preparation, teens encounter the Lord through taking on more responsibility within the parish community, serving the greater community with love, and learning more about the Catholic Faith that they will soon be fully claiming as their own. Classes are held on Sunday evenings twice a month from 6:45 pm to 8:45 pm September through April. EUCHARIST

As Catholics, we believe the Eucharist is the real presence of Jesus Christ and that He lovingly offers Himself as spiritual nourishment with each celebration of the Mass. This intimate exchange with the Lord strengthens us spiritually and brings us closer to God. Individuals unable to attend Mass may request the Holy Eucharist be brought to them as the need arises.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AT SAINT PHILIP NERI

The sacraments of Christian Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist – lay the foundations of every Christian life. The faithful are born anew by baptism, strengthened by the sacrament of confirmation and receive in the Eucharist the food of eternal life. THE SACRAMENTS AT THE SERVICE OF COMMUNION — Matrimony and Holy Orders — help members serve the community and are directed to salvation of others.

MATRIMONY

For Catholics, the sacrament of marriage, or holy matrimony, is a sign of God's loving presence in the world. The loving union of a husband and wife speaks of family values and God's values. Couples wishing to get married must contact the pastor at least six months prior to the desired date of the wedding. Preparation classes are held in the parish. Wedding arrangements must be made by calling the Parish Office at 803.548.7282.



HOLY ORDERS

Holy orders, or ordination, is the sacrament through which the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church. Let Us Extend His Call

In the sacrament of holy orders, the priest who is ordained vows to lead other Catholics by bringing them the sacraments – especially the Holy Eucharist, by proclaiming the Gospel and by providing other means of holiness. Everyone has something to contribute. When we encourage others to discern if they have a vocation to the priesthood or religious life, we show our support for their desire to serve. Our priests and deacons will happily discuss their vocation, offer insight and direction to those interested. Let us extend His call.

THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING — Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick — celebrate the healing power of Jesus.

RECONCILIATION

The sacrament of Reconciliation (also known as confession or penance) brings about a change of heart through God's mercy and forgiveness. The sacrament of Reconciliation has three elements: conversion, confession and celebration. In this, we find God's unconditional forgiveness; as a result, we are called to forgive others. The sacrament is offered every Wednesday at 7:00 pm in the church. In addition, the sacrament is available by scheduling an appointment through the Parish Office at 803.548.7282.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is not just for those at the point of death but may be received by anyone who is seriously ill or dealing with aging. Whether it is illness or the natural aging of our bodies, the Lord instituted this sacrament to help us through this process. Will we transition to health, or the eternal life hereafter? The ritual of healing is available for spiritual, physical and mental illness. This sacrament may be requested through the Parish Office at 803.548.7282.

Questions to Assist in the Discernment of our Spiritual Gifts

Spend time in careful thought and prayer and ask God to show you where He desires your presence.

- What are the things that I am "good at" that I have a talent or training for?
- How might I use my gifts to show my love for God and for one another?
- What are the contexts in my life where I have most felt the Holy Spirit working through me?
- What aspects of the church's ministries, groups and organizations listed in this Ministry of Discipleship Book do I find most energizing?
- Based on your review of these ministries, groups, and organizations, which are best suited for your gifts and abilities?
- Have you observed a need or have a desire to establish a new ministry or outreach at St. Philip Neri Catholic Church?

LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

Our Liturgical Ministries offer parishioners the opportunity to fulfill a special role in Eucharistic celebrations during daily and weekend Masses and other liturgical events. These roles, which may be either visible, or behind-the-scenes, are extremely important to the celebration of Mass. ALTAR LINENS & PURIFICATORS MINISTRY

This ministry cares for the sacred linens on a rotating schedule. Training is provided on how to care for these special linens that contain the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. BRASS ENSEMBLE AND INSTRUMENTAL SOLOISTS

These ensembles accompany the liturgy on an as-needed basis, with rehearsals scheduled by appointment. Duo, trio, quartet, and quintet ensembles are formed as needed. Woodwind and string players are needed throughout the year as well.

ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Instrumentalists are needed at times, with both students and adults invited to participate. Pianists and organists are also occasionally needed to substitute for regular participants.



Haiti Snapshot - Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere, with 80 percent of the population living on less than \$2.00 per day. Ongoing corruption, political instability, resurgent gang violence, illiteracy and barriers to education, food shortages, unemployment and vulnerability to natural disasters have kept most Haitians locked in a cycle of poverty for generations. This is not only raising the levels of hunger but is also leading to increased levels of severe child malnutrition.

With this in mind, and living our mission to continue the ministry of Christ beyond our parish and local community, we have started a Haiti Ministry that currently consists of the following:

HAITI TWINNING PROGRAM

In 2021, St. Philip Neri Catholic Church established a partnership with St. Malachy Catholic Church in Brownsburg, IN in a Haiti Twinning Program to help the community of Port Margot in northern Haiti to make improvements in health care, water, and education for the Port Margot community, pray for one another, and share concern for the needs of the parishes. ST. ANNE HIGH SCHOOL AT ST. PHILIP NERI CAMPUS


